New! The Gorebridge Community Pantry

The Gorebridge Community Pantry is open every Tuesday evening at the Gorebridge Beacon 5 – 7PM.

Open to residents of EH23, you can apply to become a member of the Pantry and shop once a week. Membership is free, and a weekly shop costs £3.50. You'll receive 10 credits for £3.50, and these credits can be used to 'spend' on fresh, ambient or store-cupboard ingredients. If available, free bread will be offered, and volunteers will make each member a bag of fresh fruit and veggies.



If you would like to become a member you can sign up at the Pantry evening, or pop into the Beacon and ask a staff member for a form. Please bring proof of address (EH23 residents only).

The Pantry is for anyone who wants to reduce their weekly bill, help save good food going to waste, and wants to support community projects that build resilience.

For the past year there have been meetings, mapping exercises, and community get togethers to create the new Gorebridge Community Action Plan. This work was led by the Coalfields Regeneration Trust, and brought together different Gorebridge groups and residents to prioritise local needs, wants and wishes.

Handy People

Part of the Development Trust Strategy is to support community wellbeing and connections.

We are currently exploring a new project called Handy People. To be honest, the project development was halted by the pandemic and all the restrictions. However, these are now behind us and we want to revisit the idea.

Handy people has a dual purpose. Firstly, it will bring people together to share skills and experience providing training and employability opportunities for local people. The second function is provide services that support residents in their homes. This might make the difference to allow people to stay in their own homes longer. Equally, it could help other groups to make a home when they are starting out. The services might seem simple or small, but sometimes these small tasks can feel huge if you don't have the skills or abilities to perform them yourself. Simple help, that makes a big difference. One hour of time can create a massive difference. A neighbourly project that helps to build a caring and resilient community.

The Community Gardeners recently held a Garden Party for the unveiling of The Queen's Green Canopy, Platinum Jubilee Tree.

The Queen's Green Canopy is a nationwide tree-planting initiative launched by Her late Majesty to mark her Platinum Jubilee.

The 'Tree of Trees' stood in front of Buckingham Palace at the height of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations in London in June 22 and was seen on TV by more than one billion people worldwide. The tree has been planted beside the Memorial Garden at the Beacon.




Cost-of-Living Emergency

Gorebridge Community Development Trust received an award from The National Lottery Community Fund, made possible by National Lottery players. Receiving £27, 500 the Trust acted as an anchor organisation, to distribute funds to support people with the cost of living crisis.

Working in partnership, the Trust was able to support 250 households and over 500 local people between Jan and April 2023. Val Cameron, GCDT Chair said 'We know the cost of living emergency is not over yet, half way through 2023 many people are struggling, we will continually look for funding streams to support our community during this time and into the Winter of 2023/24'

Hi, and welcome to The Beacon. Firstly let me introduce myself – I'm Debbie (Gorebridge incomer of 20 years) and Beacon Operations Manager. I have been in post for a little over a year and have really enjoyed working alongside our wonderful Beaconeers. John is our Facilities Manager who looks after the building. In the Café we have our Community Café Lead and chef Robert, who oversees the operations of the Community Café. Robert is also responsible for training Shona and Emily our Café Trainees. Nicola and Jemma complete the Community Café team that is at the heart of what we do.

Many of you access the community café regularly, but do you know about the other areas of activity at the Beacon community hub and social enterprise? The Beacon has several office spaces and a nursery let to SME's, charities and non-profit organisations. We also have a large airy hall let to both regular and occasional users for classes, parties, meetings and conferences. A particular highlight this year was hosting the SWI Midlothian Federation's show and welcoming over 500 people from Midlothian and beyond. We also hold our own events including regular Saturday morning play cafes and evening events that bring our community together.

We sincerely welcome everyone from our community, all staff are trained in Dementia awareness and we are working towards Communication Scotland accreditation. We are proud to be a Disability Aware, Real Living Wage employer, that supports the Young Person's Guarantee and Parental Employability Project.

Your Community Hub

As well as using the Community Café, the Beacon is available at weekends and evenings (limited) for you to use for parties, children's parties events, activities and workshops for residents, businesses and other groups.
